

On January 7, the worst fires in Los Angeles County history began. As of this writing, at least 25 people have died, 200,000 people have been evacuated, and more than 12,000 homes and structures have been either burned to the ground or left uninhabitable.

At the same time, frigid air, blizzards, and icv roads have caused death and destruction in other parts of our nation. Many of us have experienced the effects of natural disasters personally or have grieved with family and friends who have suffered losses due to floods, fires, droughts, or winds like hurricanes and tornadoes. Locally, we all know people who lost everything in the Paradise and

Loma Rica fires. The list of tragedies feels endless, as does the pain and grief they leave behind.

What struck me about the recent fires (or current ones as of this writing)

is how many of the "rich and famous" lost their homes. Some were interviewed

while standing amidst the rubble of where their houses once stood. While some openly wept, all expressed gratitude that their families were able to escape in time. The prevailing sentiment was, "We're all okay;

the rest is just stuff."

For people like me—those of us who have never experienced the wealth many of these individuals possess—it's easy to react with sarcasm: "I feel really bad for them. They've got money; they'll be fine." But after hearing their stories through

round-the-clock updates, I

realized their lives have been forever changed, too.

Mandy Moore lost her childhood home of 46 years. Dennis Quaid reflected not on the things he purchased but on the items created by his children when they were young. Yes, many of these celebrities lived in high-end areas

like Malibu and Pacific Palisades, places most of us could never afford. But what about their families and the one-of-a-kind memories tied to their homes—those irreplaceable moments we all treasure, regardless of our income?

They are hurting. They are grieving. Their loss is real and immense, and it will necessitate profound changes in their lives. LA Lakers head coach JJ shared his sadness as he watched neighbors lose their homes, feeling helpless to save

Disasters and tragedies force change. The same is true for each of us. We all face personal tragedies: the loss of a loved one, a job, financial security, an accident, or our health. Every family, every individual, will encounter hardship at some point in life. These moments



Every year my children eagerly anticipate Punxsutawney Phil's celebrated emergence from his den. For those who may not know, Phil is a groundhog in Punxsutawney, Pennsylvania with a gift for predicting weather. Legend has it that if Phil sees his shadow when he exits his lair on February 2nd, Groundhog Day, there will be six more weeks of winter.

The funny thing is that my children then remember which way his prediction went and talk about the weather accordingly until spring! They enjoy arguing back and forth about whether Phil's prediction is accurate for the year. It is somewhat amazing the power this particular shadow has. There is also another shadow that we should pay attention to.

There are only so many hours in the day and so many days in a week. As westerners, most of us are production-oriented. Many of us try to "do it all." Reality is though, we can't. This is where that other shadow comes in. When we are focused on something, that thing is getting our attention or our "light" if you will. Other tasks, maybe even relationships, are going to be in shadow. In other words, if we are saying



"yes" to something, we are saying "no' to something else.

Followers of Christ are not exempt from this. We may be under the impression that we can do more than the average person, after all, we have Christ strengthening us. But this isn't exactly what Jesus taught. Jesus Himself often cast shadows. He stayed absolutely committed to doing only His Father's will and if you read the Gospels closely, you will find that that involved a lot of "no's."

This might make a lot of us uncomfortable. It is uncomfortable. Learning to be okay leaving some things in shadow can take a lot of work. It involves learning about our limits and learning how to set boundaries primarily with ourselves. The good news is that it also frees us up to focus on what God has called us to at the time and really let our light shine.

Beyond Romance

The red and green merchandise of Christmas was barely off the shelves before the red and pink of Valentine's Day occupied the space: party decorations, paper goods, and tons of candy. Perhaps you were in that aisle looking for the perfect heart-shaped box of chocolates or the treats for your child's Valentine's Day exchange. The greeting card aisle has its own story to tell. Artificial intellegence reports that around 145 million Valentine cards are exchanged each year, a number which may jump to one billion if classroom cards are included. The economic benefit of romantic love is huge!

The economic benefit of romantic love is also validated by the success of the romcom (romantic comedy) film industry. Our souls crave romantic love and are drawn to the irresistible notion that a perfect soulmate exists. But should we be looking for love in a box of chocolates or by viewing a fictitious movie? Isn't there a love that is more compelling, more satisfying than what can be expressed in a card or received



as a bouquet of flowers?

The answer is YES! And it is not that God is against romantic love. He created it, after all! It's just that God wants to get us beyond temporal satisfaction to eternal devotion. God wants to lavish His love on us. What does His love look like?

While romantic love often looks for attractive qualities in a relationship, God loved us when we were slime-covered sinners. In fact, while we were still sinners, Christ died for us (Romans 5:8). God's love is unconditional.

Romantic love often operates on the "you do for me, and I'll do for you" model, and if that doesn't work out, partners go their separate ways. Not so with God. His love is infinite and we can never use up all the love He has to give. Nothing will separate us from the love of God (Romans 8:38-39).

Romantic love can break down when physical beauty fades of life's pressures weigh heavily, but God's love is unchangeable, immutable. His lovingkindness and tender mercies toward the believer are new every morning (Lamentations 3:22-23). Even when our beauty fades or we buckle under pressure, God's love is unfailing.

All these are beautiful sentiments about the love of God, but it is imperative that we never take them for granted. This God that loves us so much is also holy and will not tolerate sin. God's love is not weak, unfair, soft or wrong. Hebrew 12:6 tells us that the Lord disciplines the one He loves. When we seek forgiveness and restoration when we sin, God is faithful and just to forgive our sin (1 John 1:9).

In a romantic relationship, it seems we are often working to be approved by another. Again, this is not so with God. His love is gracious, unmerited favor. God's love caused Him to send His only Son to be the Savior, and one day He is coming again. His love graciously invites us into His kingdom and forever into eternity.

God's love transcends romance and it's a free gift! All we do is reach out and







AMB: Do you do any volunteer work locally?

BL: Yes. I do. There are several things I have been involved in in the past and still currently participate.

AMB: What are you involved in now?

BL: I'm a greeter at our church (Cornerstone Church, Yuba City). Many of us share the responsibility each month. It feels good to be a part of a team that does a little something for the congregation.


I'm also currently a board member for the (TCRM) Twin Cities Rescue Mission.

AMB: What is that?

BL: TCRM is an outreach program for men in need of physical help with housing, food and other essentials. They help with day to day needs. They also offer the men help with addiction issues. It is a non-profit, privately funded ministry to help bring men off the street and help them make a better life for themselves and their loved ones.

AMB: How did you get started in that?

BL: Several years ago, I was told that the mission needed some people to be a part of their board. The board oversees the finances, activities, needs, and director of the mission. Part of being a board member includes helping community awareness of the mission's service and needs. We

work with churches and other local organizations who may want to help.

AMB: How Can local community organizations help?

BL: Help can look like assisting the mission staff by providing and serving a meal at the mission. It could be food or monetary donations to the mission. They are also looking for people willing to give short testimonies of what God has done in their life. I really like feeling that I'm a part (even a small part) of helping men get back on their feet.

AMB: You mentioned that you had done other things. Tell me about that.

BL: A few short years ago, I was part of (TIP) Trauma Intervention Program. This is a program where people are trained to come alongside someone who has suffered a sudden traumatic or tragic event. Volunteers sit, pray, listen, and wait with them until family or other support comes to

take over.

Also, my late wife, Sonja, and I volunteered with the Yuba City Police Dept. There were many ways to assist local officers. This includes directing traffic or setting up barricades for events. Sometimes preparing paperwork can save law enforcement a lot of time.


AMB: Why do you volunteer at your age when you can enjoy relaxing at home?

BL: I believe it is important to be involved in those things that are around you. There is a lot of need

globally, but right here there are people that just need to know that the community is looking out for them even in small ways. You've heard these words: Matthew 25:40 "Whatever you did for one of the least of these, you did it for me".

We need to get "outside" ourselves and give where we can. That's different for everyone. One small act might make a difference for that one person. I like to tell people that being present for a person lifts your own spirits and keeps you wanting to go on and do more. We were meant to serve each other.

"Kill and Harvest." Patients are Being Euthanized to Harvest Their Organs

In the Netherlands, Belgium, Spain, and Canada, people who want euthanasia can become organ donors. (A recent report in Spain showed that 13 percent of those euthanized donated organs.) Let's call it "kill and harvest," a policy heartily approved by our ever more crassly utilitarian medical establishment.

Indeed, a recent study in JAMA Surgery applauds procuring the kidneys of the euthanized because, after five years, the organs of those killed by doctors and then transplanted have worked well — even better than kidneys donated by people after brain death. From the conclusion of the study, which discusses donation after circulatory death from euthanasia (DCD-V):

This study found that DCD-V kidney transplantation yielded a lower incidence of DGF [delayed graft function] compared with DCD-III kidney transplantation [controlled circulatory death removing life support] and yielded longterm results similar to those of DCD-III and DBD [donation after brain death]



kidney transplantation. The findings suggest that DCD-V is a safe and valuable way to increase the kidney donor pool.

Yes, DCD-V, or kill and harvest, is now its own category in organ-transplant medicine.

This is so disheartening.

Allowing kill and harvest represents to me a collapse in organ-transplant ethics. The dead-donor rule is supposed to prevent people from being killed for their organs. Letting suicidal people who qualify for euthanasia know that they can become organ donors comes perilously

close to doing precisely that, and in some cases, donating has been a factor in choosing when to be euthanized. Among the serious problems of this approach:

- People who ask for euthanasia almost never receive suicide-prevention services, and instead, may be contacted by organ-donation organizations asking for their organs. This is a profound failure of true compassion and a form of abandonment, particularly since the ability to donate could become the tipping point on wanting to become dead.
- Perceiving the suicidal who

want euthanasia as organ donors can lead to their objectification because obtaining or donating the organs can become the paramount consideration rather than their personal well-being.

- Many, perhaps most, of those killed and harvested are not terminally ill. Some of the mentally ill euthanized in the Netherlands and Belgium (and soon, in Canada) are mentally ill but physically healthy. In other words, the only reason they are dead is they were subjected to voluntary homicide.
- Hospitals are turned into killing centers because the euthanasia followed by harvesting must usually take place in a hospital adjacent to the surgical suite where the organs will be procured.

Where will this go next? Well, why not live harvesting as the means of euthanasia? After all, the patient wants to die and this could lead to even more viable organs! And don't call me an alarmist. Killing by organ harvesting is already being discussed in organ-transplant medicine and bioethics journals.

If we ever sink to that level of crassness and patient abandonment, I have no doubt

shift our journeys. But in these times, we all need support—whether financial, emotional, relational, or prayerful.

Like everyone else, I've faced critical, life-changing trials. Some of you know from past editorials or personal conversations that I've battled significant health issues. I was diagnosed with nonalcoholic cirrhosis and liver disease. Initially, it didn't dramatically affect my life or health, but it's a progressive illness. Add to that ongoing heart complications since my coronary bypass over a decade ago, and my life has become very challenging. Without going into too much detail, I am often tired, have low energy, poor sleep, and some cognitive impairment. I know many others are in far worse situations than mine, but I would be lying if I said these trials haven't been difficult for me.

I ask for your support. I've required—and am so grateful for—help with The Ambassador. Prayer support is my greatest need, along with patience as I'm not always available for phone calls or visits. Encouraging emails are always appreciated. While there's much more I could share, this article isn't about me. It's a plea for patience, grace, and compassion for all of us because, as the saying goes, we all have our own "cross to bear."

As followers of Jesus, we are called, like Simon of Cyrene, to help carry each other's burdens, not because we are compelled but because we are moved by love. Paul reminds us to "bear one another's burdens" (Galatians 6:2).

In today's fast-paced world, we often feel like we're racing just to make it through the day. My wife and I occasionally watch documentaries about life in "the olden days," and we marvel at how people managed daily tasks without the modern conveniences we enjoy. Yet, we often conclude that many of these "time-saving" devices complicate our lives rather than simplify them. Perhaps it's because we've lost the mindset of a simpler life, or maybe it's because we now face a multitude of worries: health, the environment, natural disasters, and personal crises.

Ultimately, our hope is in a big and great God who walks with us through life's storms. But that hope is also meant to extend through His people—His family—who are called to care for, encourage, and pray for one another. Christians, this is one of our most significant roles in the world: to be ready and willing to serve with grace and compassion. Sometimes, you may need me, and other times, like now, I need you. Be ready.

Disaster relief doesn't end when the news coverage fades. Older Christians can help sustain recovery efforts over the long term.

 Ongoing Prayer and Support:
 Committing to long-term prayer and financial support helps families and
- communities rebuild their lives.
 Consistent Check-Ins: Regularly reaching out to victims and volunteers shows continued care and support.

In times of natural disaster, the wisdom, compassion, and faith of older Christians are invaluable. Whether through prayer, leadership, financial giving, or offering emotional support, seniors can be a source of God's love and hope to communities in crisis. Scripture reminds us that God uses every stage of life for His glory:


No one is ever too old to make a difference. In disaster situations, older Christians can serve as the hands and feet of Christ, spreading His love, comfort, and provision to those in need.
