The mark of honor is to "keep away from strife." To rise above this means of communication. To never start an argument. To recognize where a conversation is headed and, for the glory of God and the good of others, quickly choose a different path.



•• Wait for It ••

As I quickly scroll through my Facebook information and inspiration, suddenly a series of vertical panels invites me to view "reels." I've learned that these reels are short videos posted by anyone and everyone who has learned this impressive technique. The artificial intelligence that has determined my preferences sends me reels featuring babies and animals, and I must admit that viewing them is a sweet diversion. Often a reel will begin with the words "wait for it!" This means that something surprising will happen at the end, as in a newborn saying "Mama" or some such thing. The ploy works; I usually watch till the end.

In real life, though, waiting is not so enjoyable. We wait in line at gas pumps and check out lines. We wait for results of medical tests or the call back from an interview. Brides wait for their wedding day, and young couples wait for their baby to be born. We wait for healing to come after surgery, and some sleepless nights we just wait for morning. We may wait for the work day to be over so we can finally rest. Most waiting seems endless.

The Bible is our instruction manual for many things, and numerous



examples and words of wisdom have to do with waiting and how we are to wait. Think of the heroes of our faith, their waiting, and then the ultimate surprise when God's purposes were revealed at the perfect time.

What do these six Bible women have in common? Sarah, Rebekah, Rachel, Hannah, Samson's unnamed mother, and the Shunammite woman of Elisha's time? Each of these women were considered barren, but God miraculously enabled them to conceive. Think of His delight as He suggested, "Just wait for it!" Then their babies were born!

Several men of the Bible are also notable for their waiting. Abraham waited along with Sarah for his promised heir; Joseph waited in slavery and the dungeon until he was exalted as second in command in Egypt. Caleb and Joshua waited forty years to take possession of the land God promised to His children. Job endured material, personal, and physical loss, yet suffered

patiently while waiting for God's surprise restoration. David waited to become king, Daniel waited while his prayers were being answered, and our Lord Jesus Christ waited thirty years before stunning the world with His divinity.

So, too, we are waiting. But Biblical waiting is not passive waiting around for something or someone to come along that will allow us to escape our troubles. Our waiting is wrapped in confidence that God keeps His promises as He did with the heroes of old. David wrote, "I remain confident of this: I will see the goodness of the Lord in the land of the living. "Wait for the Lord; be strong and take heart and wait for the Lord" (Psalm 27:13,14).

One of these days we are going to hear a trumpet sound and a shout. The dead in Christ will rise, and if we are alive, we will meet the Lord in the air and be with Him forever. Just wait for it!

- The Gospels tell us that Passover fell on a Friday in the year of Jesus' death. This fits the astronomical data for either A.D. 30 or A.D. 33, but not for A.D. 31 or A.D. 32.

 Five of these supplied food or drink to meet a real shortage.
 According to the Old Testment prophecy, the future Messiah would feed the hungry.
- When Jesus silenced the storm at sea, he was proclaiming his divinity. The Jews were afraid of the sea, regarding it as out of human control and only God could control it (Psalm 89:9)
- When Jesus spoke of a "good Samaritan," his words would have sounded absurd to all Jews. Jews believed that the only good Samaritan was a dead Samaritan

Becoming People of the word of god

Are you content with simply knowing a little about scripture? Perhaps you know a few chosen verses by heart. Do you ever long to know more, to have the Word of God etched into your memory? The western church is filled with Christians who can quote and understand but a sliver of scripture. Many of us have heard hundreds (if not thousands) of sermons, and yet our knowledge of and commitment to God's Word is often a 'mile wide and an inch deep". That may seem like a scathing rebuke, but it is a rebuke I had to face at the age of 49 when confronted by a friend about hiding God's Word within. The truth was, I was a scriptural lightweight!

It continues to amaze me that God can use even scriptural lightweights for His purpose. Jenni and I planted a church outside Rapid City, SD (which continues to thrive), then a few years later were called to pastor the Rawlins Foursquare Church in Wyoming. Rawlins is not exactly our sort of town, sitting on the high rolling plains of Wyoming on the continental divide at 7,000 feet and with little vegetation for miles. Our preference is trees, lots of



green, and a mountain or two. We thought we might be in Rawlins for a couple of years. We settled in and found our two years stretch to seven as we became contentedly woven into the fabric of our community. Our congregation remained much the same size. Rawlins is not exactly a 'destination' community to which people clamor to live, so there were times of growth and contraction as people came and went.

In early spring of 2000, we invited friends, Jerry and Marie Knudsen, to be ministry guests one Sunday. Jerry had memorized several books of scripture and presented them dramatically at churches along with a challenge to become memorizers of God's Word. Jerry presented the book of 1st Peter and then finished with his challenge. About a dozen people did raise their hand to indicate their intent to memorize eight verses. Several actually did much more than that.

I did not raise my hand. So, on the way home for lunch, Jerry confronted me about it. I was preaching through the book of Philippians at the time and thought I'd go for the eight-verse deal everyone else got. Jerry persisted with, "This is something you NEED to do, Rod!" In the end, I committed to memorize Philippians! I didn't for a moment think I could do it, but dutifully set out on what I thought was a daunting task. Was it a task! Well, it was not easy, but I quickly discovered it is easier than I thought, which leads me to believe that our lack of memorizing scripture is far more a matter of deciding to 'not do it' than a matter of 'I can't do it.'

In scripture, God challenges us at least one hundred and fifty times to get His Word hidden within the heart! God must be serious about this. I concur. It didn't take more than memorizing the first chapter of Philippians twenty-three years ago before I knew my life had been dramatically changed!

Through our own experience, and through the experience of those who have accepted this memorization challenge, we are confident to declare that, if you choose to make memorization a personal priority and discipline, scripture will become alive to you as it never has before. Jenni also began memorizing and now has a repertoire of nine books and several Psalms. Together we now have memorized more than twenty books or large portions of scripture and have been traveling the U.S. and, periodically, eight other countries doing nothing but sharing scripture, then letting the Lord 'bring it on home' to the hearts of the listeners. It has been quite a journey! Join us, won't you?


LIFE MATTERS presented by Yuba-Sutter Right To Life

In autumn 1994, I was expecting our third child. I waited until the end of the first trimester to retrieve my favorite maternity jumper from storage and wear it to Sunday Mass, a subtle announcement to those who had not yet heard our glad tidings through the grapevine. After Mass, a graceful, snow-white haired woman with the graciousness of a saint approached me. Gently taking my hands in hers and spreading them out to my side, she exclaimed, "Oh, you are with child!"

Her tender words and elegant tone wrapped me in dignity and beauty like a warm wool blanket on a cold Minnesota morning. It was the most nurturing thing anyone had ever spoken to me. I was not merely pregnant; I was With Child! The truth resonating through her words strengthened an awareness inside of me of the high calling of maternity. I've never forgotten her charity and support. Vernanne has since gone to the Lord, but her act of kindness lives on in the recent pro-life campaign of Hosea Initiative, a national nonprofit for which I work.

First a little background



Hosea Initiative's founder, Terry Beatley, spoke October 2017, at the Gospel of Life banquet in Marathon, WI. Nearly 400 came to hear details about her interview with Bernard N. Nathanson, .MD, the man called America's Abortion King for his role in starting the abortion industry but converting his position after the science of real-time ultrasound convinced him of the personhood of the unborn child. Terry stayed a few days after her talk to celebrate. That's where we connected.

Within the radiance of that grace-filled celebration, we talked about the prolife movement and how Hosea Initiative

would spread Dr. Nathanson's parting message of love across the country. Terry wanted a writer to compose a counter to the 8 points of propaganda NARAL (Nation Association for the Repeal of Abortion Laws) used to flip a predominantly prolife society (only .01% of the US population accepted abortion-on-demand in the early 1970s), and spawn a culture based on false freedom, greed, and deception. That deception - modus operandi of the Deceiver of Souls - was intended to destroy the life at the center of God's beautiful creation.

I accepted Terry's invitation and

started writing Hosea's counter to NARAL's scheme. The first point of propaganda strategy framed the abortion debate around CHOICE. The baby in the womb was presented as an "option," making the woman a powerful dispenser of life -- and death. My job was to formulate a counterpoint more divinely brilliant than NARAL's devilishly effective word. But my brain was not clever enough. So, I prayed, and fervently asked the Lord to enlighten my mind. [God did not disappoint.]

Soon Advent arrived, with scripture readings rich with prophecies from Isaiah: A Virgin will be with child and bear a son and shall call him Emmanuel." [Is 7:14] Then, nativity narrations from the gospels of Luke and Matthew offered more food for thought: "And Joseph also went...with Mary, his espoused wife who was great with child." [Lk 2:3-4] A Second Reading was proclaimed: "A woman, clothed with the sun, with the moon beneath her feet and on her head was a crown of twelve stars, and she was with child." [Rev 12:12]

I almost slid right off the pew -



THE ROOT

A quarrelsome behavior stems from one root: pride. We think we know better than anyone else, and we'll make sure we correct everyone, regardless of the relational cost. Our opinion is more important than people.

I begin quarrels when in my pride ...


- I want to show everyone what I know.
- If I feel I must make my point.
- I am driven to prove that I'm right and that others are wrong. (This feeds my ego).
- I want to show my (supposed) superior understanding.
- I am upset that I think someone is not hearing me.
- I feel slighted, misunderstood, and marginalized, and I must prove I'm right.
- I am hurt, and I want to retaliate. I want to make them hurt as I've been hurt. (This is called "revenge")
- I am unwilling to listen to others and admit they might have a better idea. I attack before listening humbly.
- I am unwilling to die to being "right" in order to preserve relational harmony and goodwill.



WISDOM FROM ABOVE

James, the brother of Jesus, writes God's truth to us. If I'm quarrelsome, I must humbly admit my need and seek a higher source of wisdom. I must realize that an argumentative spirit is not God's way. I must quit blaming others for the ensuing arguments but accept responsibility for my part of the equation. This will lead to wisdom. Notice how precious this is and see if it's not something you long for.

But the wisdom from above is first pure, then peaceable, gentle, reasonable, full of mercy and good fruits, unwavering, without hypocrisy. And the seed whose fruit is righteousness is sown in peace by those who make peace. (James 3:17-18)




INSULT FOR INSULT

The Apostle Peter adds life-changing, practical instructions for our home (and every arena of life) in 1 Peter 3:8-11. Meditate on this passage deeply. You will find the reasons you argue in these instructions and a simple pathway out. This will not happen overnight, but you must let this passage (and the Spirit who wrote these words) master you. Ask God to make it part of your foundational DNA, your character. To sum up, all of you be harmonious, sympathetic, brotherly, kindhearted, and humble in spirit; not returning evil for evil or insult for insult, but giving a blessing instead; for you were called for the very purpose that you might inherit a blessing. For, "The one who desires life, to love and see good days, Must keep his tongue from evil and his lips from speaking deceit. "He must turn away from evil and do good; He must seek peace and pursue it."

When you are beginning an argument, pause and realize, "I'm being a fool. This is driven by my pride. Regardless of what others are doing, I must humble myself and be willing to die to what others think about me. I don't have to show my superior thinking, correct them, or dishonor them. Right now, by the power of the Spirit of God, I must choose to abandon this quarrel before it breaks out. I do not have to win. The path to real winning is for the other person to walk away feeling loved, honored, and blessed by my responses. Lord, show me how to bless them right now."

This does not mean that I never voice an opinion and become a mindless robot. It means that I quickly abandon

an argumentative spirit when the temperature rises. I humbly choose another path.

And I must be proactive. When I am insulted or marginalized, I must not return the insult or evil but ask, "How can I bless them right now? What does the Spirit of God inside me want me to do in response that would make them feel honored and blessed?" (By the way, genuinely listening with a desire to sympathize and understand always makes others feel honored). Then, I must follow God's promptings. I must realize that people are more important than my opinions.

BY GOD'S EMPOWERING

At the core of this lifestyle response must be a deliberate, determined dependence upon the Spirit of God. The same Spirit that led Christ to respond like this.

While being reviled, He did not revile in return; while suffering, He uttered no threats, but kept entrusting Himself to Him who judges righteously. (1 Peter 2:23) Do you want to grow in foolishness? Then just keep arguing. Make no adjustments in your responses. Do what you've always done. Don't humble yourself. Make sure everyone around you gets it in the teeth to prove your point.

Since you've read this article and if you desire to change, realize that you will be tested. It will probably come before the day is out. But tests are designed to help you grow in godliness. If you desire more, and you want to please the One who made you and has a higher life for you that will bless those around you ... admit your pride, surrender to the Spirit's leadership, and trust your case to "Him who judges righteously." Don't give evil for evil or insult for an insult but give a blessing instead.

Dr. Charles Frazier Stanley died at the age of 90 on Tuesday, April 18, 2023. Many people strive to reach fame in this world, but he made his faith famous. Set free at the age of 12, when he gave his life to Christ, Charles Stanley made it his mission in life to help others find the same freedom. Born in Dry Fork, Virginia in 1932, the pastor, evangelist, broadcaster, and author of over 50 books, pastored the megachurch, First Baptist Church, in Atlanta for 51 years. He founded In Touch Ministries in 1972. A Southwestern Baptist Theological Seminary graduate, Charles Stanley "was widely regarded as one of the best preachers of his generation, along with Charles Swindoll and Billy Graham," Christianity Today reports.

He is survived by his son, Andy, and daughter Becky. Andy Stanley is the senior pastor at Northpoint Ministries. He said his father taught him and others "Not just to preach or how to build a church. But how to get to a finish line with integrity and to be able to be proud of everything that came before, and unfortunately that's increasingly rare." Many of his sermons, broadcasts, and books have provided relief and restoration. The imperfections in his



life allowed him to empathize with others, and his faith inspired all of us to soldier on in our pursuit of Christ Jesus. As he rests peacefully in the arms of his Savior, we remember some of the iconic and inspired words of one of the greatest Christian leaders of our time.

- "Obey God and leave all the consequences to Him."
- "You always have God's undivided attention."
- "We must remember that the shortest distance between our problems and their solutions is the distance between our knees and the floor." - Charles Stanley

"Handle with Prayer: Unwrap the Source of God's Strength for Living"

• "Behavior is the substance of religion. Belief is the substance of relationship." - Charles F. Stanley "God's Way Day By Day"

• "Our willingness to wait reveals the value we place on the object we're waiting for."

• "The time you spend alone with God will transform your character and increase your devotion. Then your integrity and godly behavior in an unbelieving world will make others long to know the Lord."

• "You have to have courage to be obedient to God."

• "God's plan for enlarging His kingdom is so simple- one person telling another about the Savior. Yet we're busy and full of excuses. Just remember, someone's eternal destiny is at stake. The joy you have when you meet that person in heaven will far exceed any discomfort you felt in sharing the gospel."

literally. That was it! The scriptural language used for millennia countered NARAL's campaign of "Choice." God's Word describes a woman not as pregnant, but WITH CHILD. Throughout Sacred Scripture, this is the phrase consistently used to express a mother's state of expectancy.

When we shared this revelation at one of Hosea's liberated by Truth conferences, an attendee approached to thank us. "We would have never used the word 'pregnant' when I was younger," she explained. "That was only used by men at bars, but never in mixed company." The first step to changing a culture is to manipulate the language. NARAL understood the power of semantics. The United States citizens would never vote in favor of abortion if the phrase 'with child' defined a state of motherhood. The verbiage must be

replaced, reasoned NARAL. Notice how increased use of the medical terms 'pregnant' and 'pregnancy' parallel the rise of the abortion-on-demand market from the 1970s. Eventually, these semantics supplanted the longstanding biblical language. However, collectively we can restore it.

Hosea Initiative carried posters at the National March for Life 2023 reflecting the WITH CHILD campaign, to encourage everyone to restore our culture by reclaiming life-affirming language. We can be at the forefront of elevating the beauty and dignity of motherhood every time we say a woman is WITH CHILD.

Funeral Guitarist



Though my head hung low, my heart was full.


As I opened the door to my car, I heard one of the workers say, "I've never seen anything like that before, and I've been putting in septic tanks for twenty years."


Apparently, I was still lost.

personality, experience, or desire. To put it bluntly, if you can't offer "care", you should NOT be in the health "care" field!




