
just a few years prior. Now, I find myself saying that about things that happened three, four, even five decades ago.

serving in ministry together for more than 30 years.

 That overwhelming moment in the hospital room 28 years ago when I held our first child for the first time. Now that child is nearly the age I was then.


I remember these events like they were yesterday. And they leave me wondering where all the time went. How did it go by so fast?

Like Yesterday When It Is Past

Moses felt this kind of bewilderment too, and even more when he compared our brief lives to God's life:

"Before the mountains were brought forth, or ever you had formed the earth and the world, from everlasting to everlasting, you are God." (Psalm 90:2)

Given how prone we are to see ourselves as lead characters in the drama of existence, it does our souls good to sit and prayerfully ruminate on what it means for God to exist "from everlasting to everlasting." It boggles our minds. It's supposed to. It's meant to reframe our exaggerated perceptions of ourselves and our lifetimes, so we see them from a realistic and humbling perspective —



God's perspective. It's necessary that we, who experience time in terms of decades, keep in mind that our experience is not like God's:

"For a thousand years in your sight are but as yesterday when it is past, or as a watch in the night." (Psalm 90:4)"

Moses is using metaphorical language here. If anything, he's understating the reality. But God gives us this metaphor in Scripture so we have something comprehensible to help us get some idea of the incomprehensible.

So, if we imagine that God experiences a thousand years like yesterday when it is

past, how does he experience the lives of creatures like us, who ("even by reason of strength") don't live much beyond eighty years? It means that, for God, the longest human lives don't span even two hours of yesterday.

Two Significant Hours

How should this observation land on us? If we come away with the impression that we're insignificant and don't really matter in the great divine scheme, then we're missing the point. God doesn't measure significance in terms of time duration but in terms of what he values.

Think of something you did for two hours yesterday. Were those two hours insignificant? Some of the most significant things in our lives occur in minutes and hours. They may have lasted a very brief time compared to how long we live, and yet we consider them priceless.

So, what are we meant to glean from Moses's description? Simply put, our lives are very brief—briefer than we tend to assume, and far too brief to waste.

Teach Us to Number Our Days

What this glorious but fleeting midsummer day in Minnesota is preaching to me is that my life is too brief to waste. And at 59, I see it as a metaphorical picture of my past, not my present. I'm now in the autumn of my life and, like any Minnesotan, I know that winter is coming. And it is not merely coming someday; it is coming someday soon, almost before I know it.

So, I find myself praying with Moses, "Teach me, Lord, to number my days that I may get a heart of wisdom" (Psalm 90:12). Because I want to grow wiser as I grow older.

And a heart of wisdom recognizes that while each day of mortal life is very brief, it is profoundly significant because its minutes and hours are priceless. Each brief day of mortal life counts, not just for an earthly life well-lived, but for eternity.

"Eight Babies From Tim Walz's State "Were Left to Die" After They Survived Abortions"

During September 10th's presidential debate, ABC's Linsey Davis "factchecked" former President Donald Trump's comments regarding children who survive abortions.

A chorus of journalists immediately questioned Davis' "correction" of Trump, expressing that the Republican nominee made a valid point about some states' proabortion policies.

Davis, who co-moderated the debate alongside her ABC colleague David Muir, claimed: "There is no state in this country where it is legal to kill a baby after it's born."

The moderator made the claim after Trump answered her question regarding his stance on abortion.

In Trump's answer, he said that the Democrats take a "radical" position on the issue, adding: "They have abortion in the ninth month."

Trump had also referred to a 2019 interview of then-Virginia Gov. Ralph Northam, a Democrat, who said that a "discussion would ensue between the physicians and the mother" if a baby was born alive following a failed lateterm abortion. Trump initially incorrectly referred to Northam as the former



governor of West Virginia.

Minutes after Davis attempted to debunk Trump's response, the Media Research Center took to X (formerly Twitter) with a "fact check" of its own.

"Babies are regularly murdered after they are born in botched abortions," wrote the watchdog group.

The Daily Signal's Mary Margaret Olohan wrote in an article last month, "data from the Minnesota Department of Health shows that at least eight babies who survived abortions" in Minnesota "were left to die."

Signal Managing Editor Tyler O'Neil

posted a link to Olohan's piece on X shortly after Davis' "fact check" at the debate.

Democratic vice presidential nominee Tim Walz has been the Governor of Minnesota since 2019.

"Under a 2015 Minnesota law, the state formerly was required to report whether abortions resulted in the live birth of a baby, what actions were taken to preserve the life of that baby, and whether the baby survived," Olohan continued:

Those reporting requirements exposed that between Jan. 1, 2021, and Dec. 31, 2021, physicians performed five abortions that resulted in a baby's live birth.

No measures were taken to help the first baby, who reportedly had "fetal anomalies" that resulted "in death shortly after delivery." Two of the babies were given "comfort care measures" as they died. No measures were taken to "preserve life" of the last two babies, who were previable.

Previous data from the Minnesota Department of Health reveals that physicians have been leaving babies to die after failed abortions for years.

"Not true, ABC News," wrote Family Research Council (FRC) President Tony Perkins on X Wednesday afternoon, responding to Davis' "fact check."

"In 12 states, children born alive after a failed abortion have no legal protection, and in three more states children born alive after an abortion had legal rights that governors-like Tim Walz-repealed," Perkins wrote, citing the FRC's data.

"Medical personnel have testified of babies being left to die or gruesomely killed after being born alive following a failed abortion," he added.

Perkins posted a map to X showing each state's level of protection for babies born alive following failed abortions. The



Breakpoint: The Life and Faith of Blaise Pascal

On August 19, 1662, French philosopher, mathematician, and apologist Blaise Pascal died at just 39 years old. Despite his shortened life, Pascal is renowned for pioneering work in geometry, physics, and probability theory, and even for inventing the first mechanical calculator. His most powerful legacy, however, is his Pensées, or thoughts, about life's biggest questions, including God and the human condition.

Pascal's intellect garnered attention at an early age. At 16, he produced an essay on the geometry of cones so impressive that René Descartes initially refused to believe that a "sixteen-year-old child" could have written it. Later, Pascal advanced the study of vacuums and, essentially, invented probability theory.

His life radically changed the evening of November 23, 1654, when Pascal experienced God's presence in a powerful way. He immediately and radically reoriented his life and thinking toward God. He described the experience on a scrap of parchment that he sewed into his jacket and carried with him the rest of his life:

FIRE—God of Abraham, God of Isaac, God of Jacob, not of the philosophers and



scholars. Certitude, certitude. Heartfelt joy, peace. God of Jesus Christ. My God and thy God. Thy God shall be my God.

From that moment, Pascal dedicated his life to serving God through his writing. His ideas on apologetics were collected and published after his death in a volume entitled, Pensées, or "Thoughts."

Best known of his ideas is "Pascal's Wager." Facing uncertainty in a game of life with such high stakes, he argued, it makes far more sense to believe in God's existence than to not: "If you gain, you gain all; if you lose, you lose nothing. Wager, then, without hesitation that He is."

Pascal also offered keen diagnoses of the

human condition, such as this:

The human being is only a reed, the most feeble in nature; but this is a thinking reed. It isn't necessary for the entire universe to arm itself in order to crush him; a whiff of vapor, a taste of water, suffices to kill him. But when the universe crushes him, the human being becomes still more noble than that which kills him. ... The universe, it does not have a clue.

Or even better:

What a Chimera is man! What a novelty, a monster, a chaos, a contradiction, a prodigy! Judge of all things, an imbecile worm; depository of truth, and sewer of error and doubt; the glory and refuse of the universe.


Pascal also accurately described the moral condition of human beings. For example, "[W]e hate truth and those who tell it [to] us, and ... we like them to be deceived in our favour." He also observed that people tend to distract themselves from the reality of death, but when our diversions run their course, we feel "nothingness."

A generation later, even the most prominent thinkers of the Enlightenment could not dismiss Pascal's brilliance. According to philosopher Dr. Patrick Riley,

Holbach, as late as the 1770s, still found it necessary to quarrel with the author

GRANDparents encourage their grandchildren to learn from their mistakes

One of the more powerful gifts we can give to our grandchildren (and our adult children) is to view all of life experiences (the good and the bad) as valuable life lessons that will help to form our character as we submit these difficulties one-by-one to the Lord. Some of the more sensitive grandparents among our number might resist accepting this fact. But in truth, if we shelter our grandchildren from age-appropriate life lessons we hinder their growth and development as robust change-makers in God's kingdom. Even a brief study of God's Word reveals that most (all?) biblical characters worth emulating grew in character and godliness post-seasons-of-personal suffering.

GRANDparents pray every day for their grandchildren

Given this albeit painful truth, wise grandparents will not resist the working of God in their grandchildren's lives to save them a small measure of temporary discomfort in lieu of possible permanent character development paralysis. They won't. So what is the loving grandparent to do? Get on their knees. Stay on their knees. Repeat. Repeat.

Ask the Lord for the wisdom and grace to know how to pray. Instead of simply beseeching the Lord for pain relief; how about asking that the Lord do a good work of developing strength; patience; kindness; compassion; and long-suffering in our grands' lives. Grandparents will liven up their prayer life by starting and ending with generous amounts of praise to the Lord by thanking Him for completing this good work even before the He has begun. Real life changes begin and end when grandparents are on their knees.

Compact Magazine founder and editor Matthew Schmitz wrote on X Wednesday: "In 2022, years before Tim Walz emerged on the national scene, I pointed out that babies who survived abortion procedures were being left to die in Minnesota."

Schmitz referred to a July 2022 post by pro-life journalist Micaiah Bilger.

In the post, Bilger enclosed what Schmitz referred to as a screenshot from the Walz administration's Minnesota Department of Health.

"FIVE babies were born alive in abortions and left to die in Minnesota in 2021," Bilger wrote, underlining nearly identical language in the screenshot. "FIVE – in one state!"

of the Pensées, Condorcet, when editing Pascal's works, renewed the old debate; Voltaire throughout his life, and even in his last year, launched sally after sally at the writer who frightened him every time he—a hypochondriac—felt ill.

The fallout of the French Revolution would prove that Pascal's arguments about God—who, he claimed, was essential in everything—and his observations about the human condition, were right. On the contrary, Enlightenment thinkers such as Voltaire, who argued that mankind would be better off if freed from any higher power, were shown to be naive at best. Divorced from God and committed instead to "pure reason," France devolved into a violent, anarchic wasteland.

Even today, Pascal's writing has lost none of its fire, nor has the fruits of his intellect, passion, and eloquence dedicated to God

diminished. As he wrote on the parchment sewn into his jacket,

Jesus Christ.

I have fallen away: I have fled from Him, denied Him, crucified him.

May I not fall away forever.

We keep hold of him only by the ways taught in the Gospel.

Renunciation, total and sweet.

Total submission to Jesus Christ and to my director.

Eternally in joy for a day's exercise on earth.

I will not forget Thy word. Amen.

"WHEN TWO OR MORE ARE GATHERED": EXPLORING THE MEANING OF MATTHEW 18:20

"When two or more are gathered in my name, I am there among them" (Matthew 18:20). This familiar verse is often cited during prayer meetings and church services, but its deeper meaning is often overlooked. To fully understand it, we need to examine its context and purpose.

Understanding the Context



Many interpret this verse to mean Christ is only present in group settings. While it highlights the power of community, it doesn't mean Jesus is absent when we are alone. The Bible assures us that He is with each of us individually, always.

Still, this verse emphasizes the importance of community. We aren't meant to walk our faith journey alone. The New Testament repeatedly calls for believers to support one another, serve together, and live in unity. Gathering "in Jesus' name" strengthens our bond with

each other and deepens our connection to Christ.

One of the most comforting aspects of this verse is its application to conflict. Disagreements and misunderstandings are inevitable in any community, but rather than avoid them, this verse calls us to face them together. Christ promises to be present in the process, guiding us toward understanding and forgiveness.

Kaya Jones is a Canadian-born singer, songwriter, and producer. Growing up in Las Vegas, by age 16, she had signed with Capitol Records, and in 2003, auditioned and was selected from thousands of other singers for a spot with the Pussycat Dolls. Since leaving the Pussycat Dolls, Jones developed her career as a solo artist. At 26, she became the youngest female to start her record label. In 2019, Jones won a Grammy Award for collaborating with gospel artist Jason Crabb. But this storybook existence masked a dark reality because, by the age of 16, she had the first of three abortions. Today, she shares her experience of abortion and her journey of healing.
