Taste and See

Who do you suppose was the curious indigenous New Englander who picked and ate an unknown red berry? Perhaps his face twisted at its tartness, but when he determined it did not poison him, he picked a basketful and took them to his wife. She decided to soften the fruit in boiling water and sweeten the sauce by adding honey. Did they take their new side dish to the first Thanksgiving feast? History doesn't tell us, but the lowly cranberry is immensely popular in its varied forms today in spite of its bitter origin.

God, in His infinite grace and wisdom, built into us our sense of taste. Taste helps us seek out and consume foods that are flavorful and nutritious. It helps us detect if a food is spoiled or poisonous. Taste gives us a sense of pleasure and enjoyment. We eat because it's fun and satisfying.

Our physical sense of taste, though, is just a shadow of a deeper desire God has built into us. God wants us to "taste and see" that He is good (Psalm 34:8). Just how does this work in our daily lives?

Can we taste and see the goodness of the Lord before we climb out of bed in the morning? Of course we can! That is the moment we set our course for the day. Will we choose bitter or sweet? The



Psalmist wrote: "This is the day the Lord has made. Let us rejoice and be glad in it" (119:24). Even if circumstances are bitter, or the outlook grim, we can choose to rejoice. By surrendering outcomes into God's hand, we taste the goodness of His sovereignty.

Around breakfast time, just as physical hunger activates our taste buds, we can be reminded to taste the goodness of God through His word. Before you put honey on your biscuit, consider spending time with Jesus. "How sweet is Your word to my taste! Sweeter than honey to my mouth!" (Psalm 119:103).

Throughout the day, we can taste the goodness of God by including Him in our routine. We can send up heartfelt prayers for loved ones and release our concerns into His care. God shows His goodness in His faithful promises to hear and act according to His will.

As the day winds down, you see that the goodness of God has never failed you. This may lead you to "Enter His gates with thanksgiving...give thanks to Him and bless His name for He is good." (Psalm 100:4-5). A quiet time of worship is a taste of the sweetness of God.

You may think these words are sickly sweet. Perhaps your circumstance is so dire or your pain so unfathomable you cannot find relief. God has given you a bitter cup. Oh, friend! The bitters are healing! The indigenous man who discovered cranberries used them for medicine. If you are hurting, there is no better time to taste and see that God is good. Oswald Chambers summed it up perfectly when he wrote: "If God has made your cup sweet, drink it with grace; if He has made it bitter, drink it in communion with Him." Your soul will be satisfied.

Stirred but Not Shaken

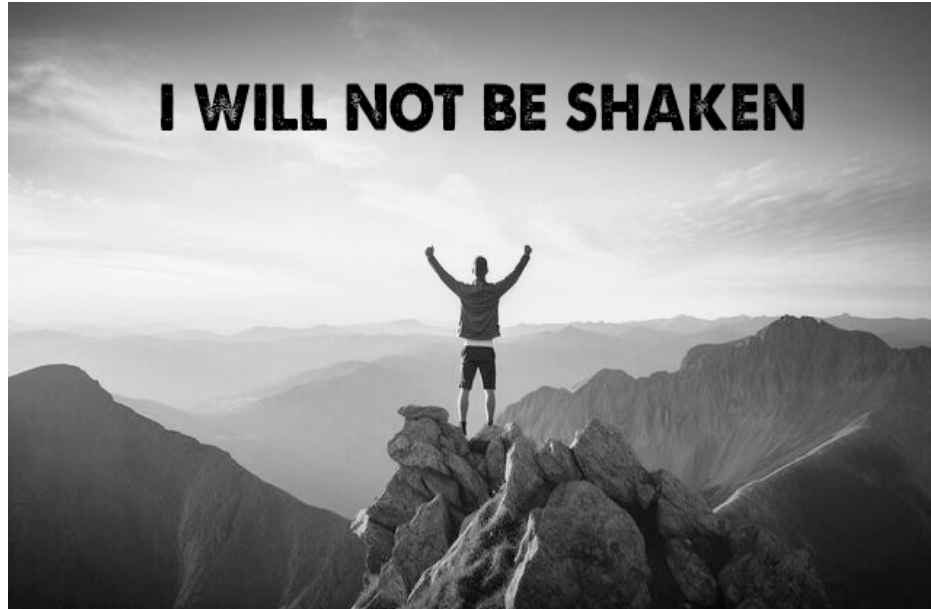

Generations of us are now acquainted with James Bond's familiar quote about wanting his martini "shaken, not stirred." "Women, Let's Get Our Praise On"

The Benefits of Praise

LIFE MATTERS presented by Yuba-Sutter Right To Life

With People Justifying Killing Charlie Kirk, The Pro-Life Message is Needed More Than Ever

We've all seen it— on TV, in the newspapers, on social media, in our cities, and in our states. Respect for human life has taken a dramatic nose-dive.

We see more violence against individuals. We see horrible killings. We see accusations of someone being a “nazi” or “fascist.” Attacks on innocent people and violence committed against complete strangers are becoming all too common. People argue more, not in a give-and-take, debate sort of fashion, but with vicious, violent language that is scary, even menacing.

Am I just imagining it? Maybe we're just seeing more wall-to-wall coverage of the frustration, anger, and even mental illness. Maybe social media just exposes, and keeps, everything in front of us on a more regular basis.

I don't think so. Over the last 5-10 years, human life has become less precious, less valuable, less cherished.

Too many people have adopted a new philosophy. Where once all human life was to be protected, treasured, and revered, in too many cases it been reduced to “I'll respect the lives of those who agree with me” or “If you don't agree



with me, you're scum, and I don't care if you live or die.”

That kind of hardness in society is distressing, frightening, and horrible.

The pro-life movement's principle that all human life is precious and should be respected—simply because we are human beings—is desperately needed.

Forty years ago, President Ronald Reagan penned an essay called, “Abortion and the Conscience of the Nation” that first ran in the pro-life quarterly journal, Human Life Review.

In his book, President Reagan quotes Mother Theresa, William Wilberforce, Abraham Lincoln, and the Declaration of independence. But the quotation that tugs at me is from the British writer, the late

Malcolm Muggeridge, who wrote, “Either life is always and in all circumstances sacred, or intrinsically of no account; it is inconceivable that it should be in some cases the one, and in some the other.”

The pro-life movement doesn't look at a person's abilities, personality, or beliefs. We see individuals, fellow human beings who have a right to be alive.

More than ever, our country needs the pro-life movement to be the conscience of the nation, holding up the banner for life and acting as a mirror, reflecting back the sanctity of LIFE.

Know that those who do not believe in universal human rights don't want us telling the world that life—all human

life— is precious.

They don't want us telling women where they can get help for an unexpected pregnancy.

They don't want us telling women they may be able to save their babies from a chemical/ medication abortion if they act quickly enough.

They don't want us telling women that chemical abortion is not safe.

They don't want us speaking up at candidate forums, townhall meetings, or school board meetings.

They don't want us electing pro-life candidates.

They just want us to shut up and go away. But we're not going to do that.

Being the conscience of the nation doesn't mean we shake our fist at people and judge them or condemn them and look down on them.

Rather, it means we remind them that every time a human life is lost, including every defenseless preborn child, we've lost a vulnerable, powerless member of our human family.

It means we let women know that if they are in a difficult position and not sure what

And we’ll do it all with love in our hearts and smiles on our faces—because LIFE is precious. The world needs our message, now more than ever.

Choosing a favorite Bible verse during tough times feels like a foodie picking their top dish—tacos, pizza, sushi, or burgers. With so many incredible flavors in the world, narrowing it down is no easy task. The Bible, like a feast for the soul, offers countless verses that speak to us in moments of struggle, each one alive with divine wisdom and comfort.

The Word of God is no ordinary book. As Hebrews 4:12 declares, “For the word of God is living and powerful, and sharper than any two-edged sword, piercing even to the division of soul and spirit, and of joints and marrow, and is a discerner of the thoughts and intents of the heart.” When we open its pages, we’re not just reading words—we’re encountering the living, breathing truth of God. 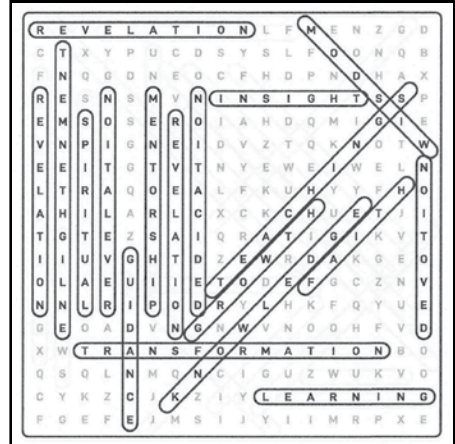


