

"While You Are Waiting"

Waiting. Groan. Unless you are unusual, waiting is not your favorite thing to do. A recent waiting experience had my mind revolving on this theme.

I was returning alone by bus after visiting a mission south of Ensenada, Mexico. The ride to Tijuana was fairly uneventful as was my walk over the pedestrian bridge where I would join others walking toward customs. The walking line was blocks long, and I was tired, so I paid to join a group that was getting on a bus that would take us directly to the customs building. It took forever to get to the customs building, forever for the passport check, forever for my bags to get scanned, but finally, I was in the USA. My forever was probably only two hours, but it seemed like so much more.

Waiting is hard and we have no control over timing. It seems to me waiting comes in seasons. Sometimes we wait with expectancy. I did expect to get across the border and ultimately home. Sometimes we wait with fear or dread. I avoided that by booking my flight from San Diego to Sacramento for the next day. Sometimes we wait with submission. Since there was no way I could hurry the crossing along, I just enjoyed my seatmate and practiced my Spanish.



The Bible has a lot to say about waiting. Every book in the Old Testament mentions waiting at least once, with Job and Psalms referencing waiting the most. In the New Testament 14 of the 27 books have examples to follow or advice on how to wait well.

Some of our Bible heroes waited with expectancy. Hannah and Sarah waited for their promised sons. The children of Israel waited for the walls to fall down around Jericho. Gideon's 300 soldiers waited for his call to drop their pitchers and shout victory over their enemy.

Some of our Bible heroes waited with fear or dread. David was often fearful and sometimes felt abandoned by God while he waited for the kingship. Abraham acted rashly when he failed to wait and so became the father of Ishmael.

Other heroes walked through these seasons and learned to wait in submission. Noah waited for the flood waters to recede. Joseph waited from the pit to the palace, knowing God meant his journey for good. Shadrach, Meshach, and Abednego waited in the furnace, and Daniel waited in the lion's den.

Another group had their expectations dashed when their Lord was crucified. They didn't understand His teaching that He would rise again. For three days they waited in fear and despair when suddenly their mourning was turned into rejoicing. Their Lord was alive!

This same risen Lord promises to be with us in our waiting. "I am with you always," Jesus said in Matthew 28:20. "Wait for the Lord; be strong and let your heart take courage; yes, wait for the Lord," the Psalmist wrote (27:14).

We all wait. Whether you are waiting in expectancy, dread, or submission, remember the risen Savior waits with you. He is also waiting for that day when He will bring you to eternal life. That's worth waiting for!

4 Surprises About America's Religious 'Nones'

The Gospel Coalition (TGC)

Pew Research Forum, one of the best and most consistent centers for research into religious belief and observance in the United States, recently released a report on religious "Nones"—the category of "religiously unaffiliated" that includes atheists, agnostics, and a sizable majority who describe their religion as "nothing in particular."

Right now, 28 percent of American adults are classified as religiously unaffiliated. We've seen this percentage increase over the years as the process of secularization continues to move forward in the United States. The trend is most evident among younger people—69 percent of the Nones are younger than 50, in contrast to U.S. adults in this age group who identify with a religion (45 percent).

The overall findings of the Pew study are what we might expect, but taking a closer look at religiously unaffiliated Americans brings a few surprises, upending presuppositions and assumptions of what our friends and neighbors think and how they live.

Ambivalent, Not Antagonistic

It's clear from the surveys that most Nones in America aren't hostile toward



religion. Yes, you find occasional opposition, especially among those who identify as atheistic. For the most part, though, the Nones are marked by ambivalence, not antagonism, toward religious people and organizations. Some point to religion as the cause of certain problems in society, such as intolerance or superstition. But many say religion helps give people meaning and purpose and that it can encourage people to treat each other well.

Takeaway: Don't assume your religiously unaffiliated neighbors are actively opposed to your beliefs or your church. They're much more likely to be ambivalent than antagonistic—to look at you with a mix of curiosity and



warn, "If Trump loses the election there will be a civil war!" One influential Christian leader even opined that it might be worth a civil war to get Trump back in office.

Uncertainty and instability and insecurity are the very relevant words of the hour.

How, then, do we keep our sanity?

First and foremost, we remember that God is still God. He still sits enthroned as the King of the universe.

He still superintends the affairs of this earth, even while giving us humans all kinds of latitude to do good or to do evil.

That's why the psalmist could say,

"God is our refuge and strength, an ever-present help in trouble. Therefore we will not fear, though the earth give way and the mountains fall into the heart of the sea, though its waters roar and foam and the mountains quake with their surging." (Psalm 46:1–3)

That means that no matter how much things shake around us, we do not need to be shaken. That also means that, if we put our focus in the right place, starting our days with worship rather than with



the news, and meditating on the Word more than focusing on the latest polls and scandals, we can have peace in the midst of the storm.

Let's also remember that there are many regions of the world experiencing much more turmoil and upheaval and danger than America. And there were plenty of times in the past that make today look like a time of stability and peace.

Yet at all times and in all places, God is our refuge and strength. As Proverbs stated,

"Whoever fears the LORD has a secure fortress, and for their children it

will be a refuge." (Proverbs 14:26)

Put another way, if God can give you peace in the midst of a tsunami or earthquake or tornado or hurricane, He can give you peace in the midst of a thunderstorm.

Jesus is still Lord, still risen from the dead, still sitting at the right hand of the Father, and still fully accessible. Walking with Him and living in Him will keep us free from fear and anxiety and despair.

So, to repeat, put your focus where it belongs and fill your heart and mind with wholesome and helpful things (see Philippians 4:6-8). It will make a massive difference in your emotional stability and inner health.

It is true that the stakes are very high, and it is true that some of our most fundamental values and freedoms are under attack.

But it is also true that, just as we survived past elections and election cycles, we will survive this one. In fact, if we, the people of God, keep our emphasis and our priorities right, we can offer peace and hope and direction to the people of the world.

We know who our Savior is. We know what our ultimate future is.

We know what really matters in the light of eternity.

Let us, then, step above the madness of the hour and the political divisiveness – while still doing our part in the election process – and let us talk about Jesus more than we talk about candidates.

It will do our own souls well. And we might just help others too.


Obituaries

DRAIN THE SWAMP? SOME CHURCHES NEED TO DRAIN THE PULPIT!

Though we may not realize it, our worldview shapes every decision we make.

A worldview is the intellectual, emotional, and spiritual filter every individual uses to experience, interpret, and respond to reality. Possessing a biblical worldview (sometimes called biblical theism, or a Christian worldview) implies that people's ideas about all aspects of life and eternity derive from scriptural principles and commands.

Spiritual leadership eventually influences and affects the next generation, either for God and biblical values or against them. Because so much is at stake, Christians must take care to not sit under woke, or spiritually wishy-washy clergy and teaching. Parents must not trust their families to those who do not hold a biblical worldview.

Arizona Christian University conducts an annual worldview survey among incoming freshmen and other respondents. The 2023 study documents significant declines among born-again Christians, indicating that a biblical worldview does not inform their actions or decisions.

A few of the survey results were alarming:

- Of American adult "born-again Christians," only 13% hold a consistently biblical worldview.
- While 22% of preteens' parents are born-again Christians, only 8% of the teens themselves hold a biblical worldview.



- About 1% of preteens have a biblical worldview.
- Of young teens, only 36% believe God exists and is the all-knowing, all-powerful Creator of the universe.
 61% either accept Jesus Christ sinned while He was on Earth or believe it's possible.
- The majority think there are no absolute, objective truths or can't apply a biblical worldview to their decisions or actions.
- 21% percent of born-again teens believe they will live with God in eternity because of a personal decision to trust Christ, but nearly double that believe in reincarnation.
- Roughly 25% of parents of preteens relegate to their churches the responsibility of instilling a Christian worldview in their children.

Can the church, its pastors, or Christian leaders instill a biblical worldview in the youth entrusted to them?

So, can parents be confident about the churches to which they have delegated the spiritual mentoring of their kids? You tell me; In America today in 2024:

Only 51% of senior pastors have a consistently biblical worldview.

- Less than 30% of associate pastors hold a consistently biblical viewpoint.
- Only 13% of teaching pastors hold a biblical worldview.
- Of youth pastors, only 12% have a consistently biblical viewpoint.

The research shows churches, pastors, and youth leaders are increasingly unreliable for truly Biblical discipleship. The survey offers several insights parents can use to instill a biblical Christian worldview in the next generation.

One: Begin early. "Train up a child in the way they should go..." (Prov. 22:6) A person's worldview starts developing in the second year of life and is largely in place by age 13, giving parents a small window of opportunity for discipleship.

Two: Instill and continuously reinforce your children's spiritual foundation. Scripture holds parents responsible for developing a child's biblical worldview (Deut. 6:1-9; Prov. 2:1-13; 22:6; 23:13; 2 Cor. 12:14; and Eph. 6:4).

Three: "Outsourcing" is a troubling

trend, as parents increasingly delegate spiritual child-rearing to others. I've said this before to hundreds of audiences, and I'll say it here: Lose at anything else but win with your children!

Four: Given the statistics, it's a gross understatement to say that current approaches to biblical worldview development are not working!

George Barna, a trusted survey developer commented, "The impact of arts and entertainment, government, and public schools is clearly apparent in the shift from biblical perspectives to a more experiential and emotional form of decision-making."

If you are in a church that teaches a biblical worldview, praise God!

If not, leave. Do not be misled by clergy who are either unable or unwilling to courageously proclaim God's truth and call Christians to bold obedience. Take your family and your money and leave. Your children's spiritual future is at stake.

Our nation's worldview — and our very survival — hinges on a return to truth in this generation.


MENTAL HEALTH MINUTE "What is Mental Health? What is Mental Illness?"

What is Mental Health?

There is a lot of confusion in society over what Mental health really means. There are clinical and textbook definitions that may be difficult for the general non-medical public to fully grasp. In a nutshell, mental health is the "well-being" of a person. It is the ability to control thoughts and emotions, have healthy relationships, and live productively in society.

However, measuring mental health is not so simple. Instead of labeling someone (or yourself) as Mentally healthy or ill, imagine a spectrum of mental well-being – from flourishing at one end to facing tougher times (languishing) at the other. It's recognizing that everyone experiences highs and lows. Mental health is about acknowledging our feelings, seeking support, and fostering healthy coping mechanisms. Just as we prioritize physical health, understanding and nurturing our mental well-being is key to leading a fulfilling and balanced life

In addition, many of us have "built-in" issues that push us further along the continuum. Traumatic

experiences, a difficult childhood, and physical or relational suffering/loss can serve to move us away from flourishing toward languishing. For example, the covid pandemic which resulted in loneliness, fear, grief and much more, pushed millions of people toward the languishing side of the continuum.

What is Mental Illness?

If Mental Health is the ability to control our thoughts and feelings, have healthy relationships, and be productive, then Mental Illness is the inability to maintain that. It is when this inability causes distress in daily life management. Severe languishing for an extended period should be evaluated by a physician in order to rule out physical issues and potentially make a referral to a mental health professional. Mental illness cannot or should not be diagnosed quickly. Unlike a physical illness or injury which may be confirmed by an x-ray or lab test, mental illness can take time to diagnose as the mental health professional needs to gain more personal information and history from the patient before making a diagnosis and suggesting a treatment plan. Mental illness involves grappling with significant challenges that affect our thoughts, emotions, and actions. It goes beyond the occasional ups and downs, presenting as persistent conditions like anxiety, depression, or bipolar disorder. These conditions impact daily life, making it crucial to recognize and address them. It also can cause relationship problems due to acting out followed by non-empathetic responses from others.

Understanding mental illness requires compassion and awareness. It's not a character flaw but a genuine health concern, much like any physical ailment. Once daily living, relationships, or productivity is affected, professional medical support (primary doctor, therapist, psychologist/psychiatrist) should be sought out. Seeking support, whether through therapy or medication, is a proactive step towards managing mental health. By fostering open conversations and dispelling myths, we break the stigma surrounding mental illness, creating a world where individuals feel empowered to seek help without judgment.

LIFE MATTERS PRESENTED BY YUBA-SUTTER RIGHT TO LIFE Elon Musk's Post On Hormonal Birth Control Goes Viral; Women Respond With Their Negative Experiences

Billionaire Elon Musk posted about the side effects of hormonal birth control pills on Friday, setting off a host of women to reply to the post with their own negative experiences from taking the contraceptive.

Hormonal contraceptive, a.k.a "the pill," is extremely common among women and girls, and is sometimes even recommended for youths for something as benign as acne. However, side effects from the pill are hardly talked about, though some women in recent years have spoken out about ditching the pill following such side effects.

"Hormonal birth control makes you fat, doubles risk of depression & triples risk of suicide," Musk posted to X. "This is the clear scientific consensus, but very few people seem to know it." The post has already been viewed more than 37 million times.

The SpaceX CEO followed up with a link to a Time magazine article highlighting the increased risk of suicide associated with the pill. He also linked to a study in the American Journal of Psychiatry that found hormonal contraception to double the risk of suicide attempts, and triple the



risk of suicide.

The responses to the post included women lauding Musk for bringing attention to the issue, and sharing their own stories.

Abby Johnson, a former Planned Parenthood clinic director-turnedpro-life advocate, responded: "Hormonal birth control gave me pseudotumor cerebri, which causes debilitating headaches and if untreated, blindness," she wrote. "I will have to be on medication for my entire life or otherwise lose my sight."

"Fertility is a sign of HEALTH!!!," Johnson stressed. "Don't take a pill to break something that is working! I'm so thankful to have gotten off that crap and now have 8 beautiful children."

Ashley St. Clair of The Babylon Bee recounted her experience after being on the pill for nearly a decade, starting at age 14.

"I was placed on the pill at just 14 years old for acne. A few months later, I saw my first-ever therapist despite no prior history of depression," she wrote. "Shortly after that, I was placed on an SSRI. Each time I would talk to my doctors about my deteriorating mental health, not a single one in nearly a decade of being on the pill suggested that it may in fact be the hormones I was taking every single day. Not one."


"In retrospect, after being on birth control for nearly a decade, being placed

on the pill for 'acne' was akin to killing a mouse with a rocket launcher," St. Clair continued. "Hundreds of thousands of women across the United States and the world have had a similar experience to mine — feeling completely out of their mind on a pill their doctor told them was relatively 'harmless.'"

"I've been (wrongfully) slandered time and time again as an anti-science conspiracy theorist for pointing out all the legitimate reasons why we shouldn't shut off our natural hormonal functioning," writer Andrea Mew posted, captioning screenshots of her columns on the topic published at Evie magazine. "Is the tide finally turning for mainstream opinions on hormonal birth control?"

"I can vouch for the weight gain and mood swings, etc. I took this stuff for about 2 years as a very young wife," another woman responded to Musk. "Hated the way it made me feel, and stopped taking it. I'm a grandmother now ... never regretted getting off the pill. I feel the same way about many modern meds. Be careful folks and listen to your body."

Other women discussed the increased risks of both breast cancer and cervical cancer associated with the pill.

respect than with disdain or hatred.

Scientific but Spiritual

The Nones place a high value on science, but most believe in God or a higher power (70 percent) or in spiritual forces beyond the natural world (63 percent). Only 17 percent identify as atheists. Half of those whose religion is "nothing in particular" maintain a belief in heaven, and 41 percent believe in hell. Nearly a quarter of all Nones believe in God, the human soul, the supernatural, and heaven and hell.

Yes, the Nones see themselves as more scientifically minded than their religious friends and neighbors, but they don't necessarily believe science can explain everything about our world. About half say spirituality is very important to their lives. Most believe spirits and spiritual energies exist in the world, in nature, in animals, in the connections between humans, and so on. More than half engage in some type of spiritual practice (centering themselves, spending time in nature, meditating, exercising, or practicing yoga) as a means of connecting with something bigger than themselves.

Takeaway: I'm reminded of N. T. Wright's illustration of secularism as a sidewalk with more and more cracks,



through which patches of spirituality are irrepressibly pushing their way like the grass. We should welcome the spiritual interest of the Nones as a starting point for spiritual conversations.

No Religious Observance, but No Civic Involvement Either

Pew's research shows most of the religiously unaffiliated Nones (excluding those who identify as atheist or agnostic) tend to be civically unengaged. This is an important point to consider as we see the decline of institutions, associations, and community involvement across the country.

The "nothing in particular" Nones are less likely to vote, less likely to volunteer their time, less likely to express satisfaction with their local communities, and less likely to say their social lives are going well. Seen in this light, the lack of religious observance coincides with a general disengagement from civic life altogether.

Takeaway: Many of the religiously unaffiliated likely feel they're on their own. We can look for ways to tap into or give voice to the longing in the human heart for strong relationships, good institutions, and healthy communities.

Skeptical of Religious Teachings and Institutions

The main reason the Nones aren't religious is that they question the teachings of organized faith. Sixty percent say their doubts about religious teachings are the primary reason for their unbelief. They're religiously unaffiliated due to a mix of skepticism,

unbelief, and, for a substantial minority, a dislike of religious organizations. Only 30 percent cite bad experiences with religious people, but 55 percent mention religious organizations or religious people as a reason they stay away.

Interestingly, about 4 in 10 Nones say they don't feel a need for religion, and 12 percent say they don't have time for religious observance.

Takeaway: Our witness matters. Are we the best neighbors? Are our churches contributing visibly to the common good? And if many friends and neighbors see no need for religion yet still maintain belief in God and some kind of spiritual practice, how can we get better at answering questions when doubts arise and demonstrating the link between a person's longing for connection with God (expressed through a generic spirituality) and the Christian faith in all its fullness?

Much more could be unpacked from this Pew Research study on the Nones. But it gives us a glimpse of a significant and growing segment of our mission field in North America.


