

I have news for some of you. These are not "distractions", but the very "essence" of our being! We are not "good" people who get off track. We are bad people


We live in a society and culture that essentially denies the existence of God.





One of my favorite Sunday School songs is "Wide, Wide as the Ocean," written in 1914 by C. Austin Miles:

Wide, wide as the ocean, high as the Heaven above;

Deep, deep as the deepest sea is my Savior's love.

I, though so unworthy, still am a child of His care;

For His Word teaches me that His love reaches me everywhere.

It was spending time on breathtaking California beaches recently that challenged me to find words of praise to express the grandeur of God. As is often the case, those words came from the Psalms and lyrics of gospel songs like the chorus above.

There is much about the ocean that reveals the character of God. The vastness and endlessness of the water illustrate His eternal nature, and the billowing waves and frothy tides remind us that He is in control. The Psalmist expresses in chapter 107 that sailors who do business on great waters see the works of the Lord (vs. 23). In His sovereignty, God commands stormy winds to lift up the waves of the sea, but He also calms



them with His word (vss. 25, 29). The way God uses the ocean as a home for sea creatures reveals His creativity and care for the works of His hands.

The ocean has ways to reveal our character as well. The ocean lets us see how small we are, and in the light of God's grandeur how unworthy we are. Yet, as the song says, though we are unworthy, still we are children of His care. For me, fearfulness was also exposed. As I watched children dart in, stick a toe into the water, and then run back out, I wondered if I don't often treat God that way. It's a lack of trust. Once fully in the water, I learn that buoyancy will hold me up, just like the loving hand of my Father that reaches everywhere.

My favorite song of praise when I visit the ocean is the third verse of "The Love

of God", a song written by Fredrick M. Lehman in 1917 which he based on a Jewish poem written in 1050. It goes like this: "Could we with ink the ocean fill/And were the skies of parchment made/Were every stalk on earth a quill/ And every man a scribe by trade/To write the love of God above/Would drain the ocean dry/Nor could the scroll contain the whole/Though stretched from sky to sky."

The imagery in that song is gripping as I visualize the sky filled with God's love letter to me. His love is endlessly deep and everlastingly wide and will never run dry because in Jesus we have a fountain of water springing up into everlasting life. Oh, that reminds me of another song, "Deep and Wide"! Aren't you glad God's love is that big?

An old adage says "Birds of a feather flock together." This indicates that birds of different species do not gather into flocks. We know from observation that this is true. Sparrows do not mix with quails and quails do not mix with a flock of geese.

In thinking about why this is true, it occurred to me that there are several reasons. The main is that God made each species differently-each "according to their kinds" (Genesis 1:2). They have somewhat of a different diet. They often nest in different places and have totally different habits. They also fly at different altitudes. In other words, they have different requirements, habits, and interests.

People also flock. They are sometimes referred to groups or even groupies. The Bible uses the term flock in referring to God's believers, often comparing them to a flock of sheep tended to by The Good Shepherd.

It would appear that people flock for the same reasons birds do. They have similar requirements, habits, and interests. There are all kinds of groups (flocks) that we belong to determined



by a bond of common requirements and interests. For years, my business drew me to groups who shared a common interest in recreational vehicle parks and campgrounds. These group meetings were normally not attended by those who had no interest in that business. Our interest and habits are undoubtedly the main reason we gather in groups or flocks.

As I view mankind, it would seem that there are basically just two groups. While there are many sub-groups, depending on how one wants to categorize them, there are two main groups. The first includes those who by their actions express belief that this world and this life is all that matters. The second includes those who by their action express a personal belief that spiritual things beyond this world and life are of greater value.

These two groups, like birds of a feather, tend not to flock together. Each flock gathers in places that support their lifestyles and interests-just as birds do. It is not for me to say where each of those gathers, as I think that it is fairly evident.

The Bible teaches that as believers we should flock together, and it tells why we should do so. The writer of Hebrews admonishes the Christians: "Let us hold unswervingly to the hope we profess, for he who promised is faithful. And let us consider how we may spur one another on toward love and good deeds. Let us not give up meeting together, as some are in the habit of doing, but let us encourage one another-and all the more as you see the Day approaching" (Hebrews 10:23-25).

While it is said that eagles don't flock, most of us have not reached the eagle status in our Christian lives. We still need the support of fellow believers.

"In the third year and fourth year there was still nothing from the bamboo seed. But I did not quit on the bamboo."

I will not quit on you! Don't compare yourself to others. The bamboo had a different purpose than the fern. Yet they both make the forest beautiful. Your time will come," God said to me. "You will rise high."

"How high should I rise?" I asked. "How high will the bamboo rise?",



LIFE MATTERS presented by Yuba-Sutter Right To Life "Abortion is a Tool of Control"



Laci Peterson

It was the murder trial of the century. Scott Peterson was tried and convicted of killing his wife Laci when she was eight months pregnant with their son Connor. After the bodies of his wife and child washed up on shore Scott was sentenced to life in prison without the opportunity for parole.

That trial captivated millions of Americans and showcased a serious problem in America.

Murder is one of the leading causes of death for pregnant women.

The Laci Peterson case isn't alone in grabbing headlines. A quick online search produced a study funded by the National Institute of Child Health and Human Development. Women who are pregnant or up to one year postpartum SEVEN CONTRACTOR

have a 35% higher risk of dving by

homicide than women who were not

pregnant. These more recent cases, which according to statistics are just the tip of the iceberg, show that abortion is a tool

of control.

Logan Barclay of Wisconsin was arrested in April 2024 for the death of his pregnant girlfriend.

He confessed to shooting Kiersten Hansen because she was pregnant and refused to get an abortion. Barclay told detectives that when she wouldn't stop talking about the pregnancy, he shot her in the stomach. He told police that when he shot her, she "freaked out and dropped to her knee, and I walked away."





Karylin Fiengo

Karylin Fiengo was shot and left in a Florida park. She was approximately 12 weeks pregnant at the time. Her boyfriend, Donovan Faison was arrested and charged with two counts of felony homicide – one for the mother and another for her unborn child. Faison was angry that Karylin refused to have an abortion.



Raquiah King

Raquiah King was found with a bullet in her back. The autopsy showed she was 12 weeks pregnant. Emmanuel Coble, her partner, did not want to be a father. After considerable pressure, he coerced her into making an appointment for an abortion at Planned Parenthood, but once there Raquiah changed her mind.

Her mother reported that Raquiah told her if anything happened to her, Emmanuel was responsible. Coble, a junior grade lieutenant in the US Navy was arrested and charged with the deaths of his girlfriend and their unborn child.



Candace Picken

Candace Pickens loved being a mom to her three-year-old son Zachaeus and rebuffed her partner, Nathaniel Dixon's insistence she get an abortion. In an act of pure evil, Dixon executed Candace at close range with a gun. Compounding this heartless violence he also shot Zachaeus in the head, but the child survived. The boy now lives with the memory of seeing his mother brutally killed. Dixon was charged with first-degree murder and attempted firstdegree murder.

Research shows that as many as 64% of American women feel coerced or forced into having an abortion. Another study shows the incidence of pregnancy-associated murders is rising in the United States.

This is further evidence that abortion hasn't liberated women. Abortion is a tool of control. It is being used to manipulate their behavior and in a growing number of cases, because it has debased the value of women, their lifeless bodies are cast aside if they don't do their partners' bidding.

We talk a lot at STR about what it means to be an ambassador for Christ (remember 2 Corinthians 5:20?). You might have wondered how this works out in the nuts and bolts of daily life. It occurred to me that sometimes being a good representative of the Kingdom hinges on the simplest things, almost trivial.

Let me give you an example from my own life.

I have had some of the most interesting conversations about spiritual matters with ordinary people who serve my table in restaurants. Since any contact with others is an opportunity to be an ambassador, I try to keep an eye open for what might turn out to be a "divine appointment."

This is something you can do, too. Here are some ways to set the stage to engage them in a friendly way.

First, find out the server's name. This is simple if they're wearing a nametag. If not, simply ask. If it's a

unique name or suggests some ethnic history, ask about it. It's a friendly thing to do—even flattering—and will help you remember their name better.


The second thing to do: Leave a decent tip. (The after-church crowd is notorious for stiffing the restaurant help.)

There's one last thing I do, and it may be the most important. As I'm walking out, I make a point to find the waiter or waitress and simply say, "Thank you." It's a small gesture, but I want their last impression of me to be as pleasant as their first. What's the real goal behind this modest effort? Simply this: People are important to the Lord, and if they are important to Him, they should be important to you and me.

Addressing a person by their name and showing genuine appreciation for service are simple ways to show that they are valued. This speaks volumes about the One you represent. Never underestimate the role of simply being warm and pleasant.

How do they know I'm a Christian? Maybe they don't. However, since we always bow our heads to give thanks at our table, and the server may overhear snatches of conversation about spiritual things, it's certainly possible they'll make the connection. The last thing I want anyone to do is associate my prayer or my Bible or my Christian tract with rudeness, stinginess, or a demanding, high-maintenance customer.

It may be that we never get around to spiritual matters—in point of fact, we usually don't. Even so, I still want to leave behind a "fragrant aroma" for the sake of Christ. That's one of the reasons Paul says in Colossians 3:17, "And whatever you do in word or deed, do all in the name of the Lord Jesus"—that is, as His representative and consistent with His wishes.




